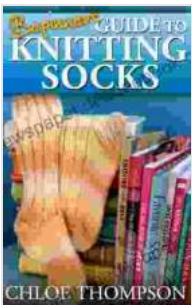

Getting Started: Mastering the Basics

Forming the Heel

1. When the cuff is complete, divide the stitches into 3 parts: left side (16 stitches), heel (16 stitches), right side (16 stitches). Mark these sections with stitch markers.
2. Turn the heel by knitting across the left side and then the heel section (16 stitches). Slip the next 8 heel stitches to a holder.
3. Turn and purl across the remaining 8 heel stitches. Knit back across these 8 stitches and continue knitting the right side.
4. Repeat steps 2-3 until you have knit all the stitches on the holder. Bind off all heel stitches.

Creating the Gusset

1. Pick up 8 stitches along the side of the heel flap.
2. Work in a 2x2 rib pattern, increasing 1 stitch at the beginning of every other needle until you have 32 stitches on the needle.
3. Repeat for the other side. You should now have 64 stitches on the needle.

Knitting the Foot

Continue knitting in the round in stockinette stitch (knit every round) until the foot reaches the desired length. To measure, try the sock on or use a measuring tape.

Shaping the Toe

1. Divide the toe stitches into 3 parts: left side (16 stitches), toe (16 stitches), right side (16 stitches).
2. Knit 2 together at the beginning of every other needle on the toe section until there are 8 stitches left.
3. Cut the yarn, leaving a tail for weaving in. Thread the tail through the remaining stitches and pull tight to close the toe.

Finishing Touches

1. Weave in any loose ends.
2. Launder the socks according to yarn care instructions.

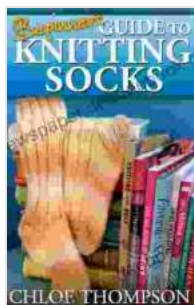
