




Piccalilly's simple act of kindness brings joy to the veterans, reminding them that their sacrifices are remembered and appreciated.

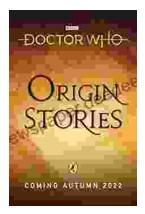
